Faculty Minute Book - First Meeting

Faculty, Fordham Law School

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Meeting of Faculty Sept 1907.

The following rulings were made.

- 1) That no student should receive a degree in the School unless he has spent at least one year in regular attendance.
- 2) That if a student come from another Law School of approved standard, a certificate of attendance of courses completed will be sufficient. He may be presumed to be of good moral character.
- 3) That no student is to learn his exact marks in examinations. The letters - A. B. C etc. indicating his ~~standard~~ standing on the regular statement will represent per-centage.
A. 90 - 100 B. 80 - 90 etc.
- 4) That the attendance of students at lectures is to be recorded ten minutes after the beginning or ten minutes before the end of each lecture, and a student must be present both times to be duly recorded.
- 5) That to facilitate such recording the chairs should be numbered and students assigned to them.
- 6) That the names of the students who win scholarships are to be announced through the Bulletin Board or in the Catalogue.
- 7) That the Condition Exams are to take place within the first month after the opening of Schools.
- 8) That "Moot Courts" were first to form a regular part of the work of the Law School - but were to be allowed or encouraged should the students on their own initiative wish to organize them.
- 9) The fourth year for the degree of Ad. M. was discussed & after some exchange of views it was thought advisable to postpone a decision.
