












DEAN'S REPORT

REPORT OF THE DEAN

Fordham University School of Law

This is an exceptional year in our School's history as we celebrate our 90th year "In the Service of Others." As you will see, the spirit of community service which has characterized the Law School since its beginning continues today through the leadership of our outstanding faculty, the dedication of our students, and the enormous support of our alumni. This Report reflects the achievements of our community and underscores, I believe, like nothing else, the vitality and commitment to excellence that have been hallmarks of the School since its inception.

As you are aware, last year was one of the most rewarding periods in memory. We won two national championships in moot court competition: the National Moot Court Championship, where we finished first in a field of 230 teams from 150 law schools, and the Craven Constitutional Law Moot Court Competition at the University of North Carolina, where we finished first in a competition of teams from twenty-six law schools. The School's Public Interest Resource Center received a national award, for the third year in a row, and our faculty voted to adopt pro bono guidelines for itself, becoming perhaps the first law faculty in the nation to make such a commitment to public service. A detailed discussion of our many public service activities is found in this Report.

I am very pleased to say that alumni support in these difficult economic times continues to be extraordinary. This is particularly meaningful in light of the soaring tuition costs borne by students and the need to maintain our physical plant, while upgrading our technical services. This Report recognizes the special people whose generosity help us meet our goals and to whom we owe so much.

The Report also outlines the work of our faculty and specifically features profiles of our Business, Tax, and Clinical faculties, continuing the closer look at faculty achievement initiated last year.

D E D I C A T I O N As I begin this 90th Year Report, I wish to dedicate it to the memory of Professor John Calamari, an indomitable figure within the Law School community for forty years. He represented all that was right with Fordham and all that was right in the legal profession. This especially can be seen by the number of tributes he received at the time of his death, both from inside and outside the



Law School. Most notably, testimonials to his life were published in the *New York Times* and the *Fordham Law Review*. Of Professor Calamari, Professor Joseph Perillo said, "[to] almost forty years of Fordham Law School graduates, the phrases 'John Calamari' and 'Alma Mater' are functional equivalents." Professor Constantine Katsoris said, "John Calamari was a Triple Crown Winner, receiving the three highest awards Fordham Law School could give . . . : the Keefe Award from the students . . . , the Dean's Medal of Recognition, and the Alumni Medal of Achievement." These expressions of love and admiration by both his colleagues and students are a lasting tribute to his remarkable career, sterling character, and gentle humanity.

THE YEAR IN REVIEW

The 1994/95 School year opened with the completion of the first phase (\$4.5 million) of our building improvement program, made possible by a loan from the New York State Dormitory Authority. The renovation increased the number of classrooms and offices for student organizations, made more effective use of the School's corridors and storage spaces, upgraded our electrical systems, and improved access for disabled students. I know that a number of you have been impressed with the changes as well, since we have received many compliments regarding the earthtone wallcovering in the hallways and the lobby with its mahogany moldings and art-deco light fixtures. Please do come and see what we have done at the School!

In May, we were excited to learn from the White House that the School had been awarded a grant of \$123,420 through the United States Information Agency to provide conflict resolution training for local citizen groups in Northern Ireland. Working in partnership with the Center for the Study of Conflict at the University of Ulster in Northern Ireland, we will design and offer a comprehensive workshop next spring or summer to train local citizens in non-adversarial methods of conflict resolution.

At its meeting of May 2, 1995, the faculty approved a new joint degree program with our nationally-recognized Graduate School of Social Service. The Program will allow a student to obtain both a J.D. degree and a master's degree in social work (M.S.W.) in four years. Our existing joint degree program with our Graduate School of Business Administration (J.D./M.B.A.) is enjoying a high degree of popularity, with close to thirty students enrolled.

Our Stein Center, Institute, and Scholars Program had another successful year, the highlight of which was a luncheon in May honoring Louis Stein and the first graduating class of Stein

Scholars. At the luncheon, we announced another major gift to the School by Mr. Stein, in the amount of \$1.1 million. To express our appreciation to him and to recognize the significance of all that he has done for the School over the years, we have honored him by placing on the front of our building, the inscription: "Louis Stein Center for Law and Ethics."

Faculty Scholarship, Community Service, and Other Activities

Faculty productivity as expressed by writings in law reviews, continued at a very high level throughout 1994/95, with articles appearing in twenty-two different journals, including the *American Journal of Criminal Law*, *University of Pennsylvania Law Review*, *Michigan Law Review*, *Ohio State Law Journal*, *Notre Dame Law Review*, *Columbia Law Review*, and *Illinois Law Review*. Also published were five books, nine book parts, and twenty-eight newspaper articles and columns. More detailed information regarding faculty publications is contained in the bibliographic material inside the back cover of this Report and in the profiles of our Business, Tax, and Clinical faculties below.

Faculty Presentations

Many members of our faculty gave presentations to different audiences throughout the country, and abroad as well. To recount only a few, Professor Roger Goebel spoke on the addition of new member states to the European Union at a meeting of the Association of the Bar's Committee on Foreign Law and at the World Congress of Comparative Law held in Athens. moderated a panel discussion consisting of our Professor Abner Greene and Ruti Teitel of NYU, on behalf of our Christian Law Students Association and Jewish Law Students Association, on the Supreme Court's recent decision in *Kiryas Joel v. Grumet*.

Professor Deborah Denno gave a talk on law and genetics at an open meeting of the Ciba Foundation and the Wellcome Centre for Medical Science in London. Professor Carl Felsenfeld gave his popular series of lectures on the financial services system for practicing lawyers. Professor Jill Fisch participated in a roundtable discussion on pending legislation in the House of Representatives at the Association of the Bar of the City of New York. Professor Martin Flaherty presented a paper on Anglo-Irish Constitutionalism in the Eighteenth Century at a two-day legal history conference sponsored by the Lawyers Committee for Human Rights. Professor Hugh Hansen gave a speech entitled "Magill: A Policy Analysis" to the IBC Conference on Competition Law. Professor Tracy Higgins gave a lecture on discrimination against women in the workplace at the New School for Social Research.

Professor Nicholas Johnson was a speaker and panel moderator on non-agricultural pesticide use at the Association of the Bar of the City of New York. Professor Robert Kaczorowski was a panelist at the Cardozo School of Law Symposium on Bondage, Freedom, and the Constitution. Professor Michael Malloy lectured on U.S. International Banking Regulation at the University of Tubingen in Germany.

Professor Russell Pearce spoke at the Brooklyn Heights Synagogue on the subject of social justice and reform Judaism. Professor Joel Reidenberg presented a paper on the fundamental role of privacy and confidence in the network at the Wake Forest University School of Law Symposium on the Information Infrastructure. Professor Terry Smith gave a PALS Civil Procededure lecture, as he did during the prior academic year. Professor Linda Sugin attended numerous tax law conferences, including the Columbia School of Law Colloquium on Law and Economics: A Political Theory of Corporate Taxation. Professor Joseph Sweeney delivered a lecture on International Commercial Law at Seton Hall University.



Government Service

In 1994/95 some of our professors advised the U.S. government on various matters. Professor Dan Capra was a consultant to Senator Minority Leader Tom Daschle on the line-item veto legislation and was also consultant to Senator Patrick Leahy of Vermont on legislation which proposed changes to the exclusionary rule. Professor Abraham Abramovsky testified before the United States Civil Rights Commission. Professor Matthew Diller testified before the



Social Security Subcommittee of the House Committee on Ways and Means concerning proposed changes in the process of determining eligibility for disability benefits.

Professor Joel Reidenberg testified as an expert witness at hearings on the National Information Infrastructure before the United States Information Infrastructure Task Force and served on two advisory panels for studies prepared by Congress' Office of Technology Assessment. Profesor Deborah Denno served as a member of the United States Sentencing Commission's Task Force on the Relationship Between Drugs and Violence. Professor Carl Felsenfeld was appointed to the Federal Office of Technology Assessment in its International Money Laundering Research Project.

Professor Jacqueline Nolan-Haley assisted in conducting training for the new mediation program in United States Bankruptcy Court. Professor Nicholas Johnson presented testimony on the Second Amendment at the invitation of the Judiciary Committee of the House of Representatives, Crime Subcommittee. Professor Michael Malloy testified at a hearing before the Subcommittee on Oversight of Government Management, Senate Committee on Governmental Affairs, on oversight of the FDIC and the RTC's use of D'Oench, Duhme & Co. v. FDIC.

International Activities

This last year some members of the faculty also served at the international level. Professor Abraham Abramovsky was invited by the Falcone Foundation to attend the Organized Crime Symposium in Palermo, Italy. He also hosted various members of the Ukrainian Law Enforcement Community, who were engaged in the formation and introduction of legislation to combat organized crime and money laundering in the Ukraine—a program coordinated with the USIA. Professor Tracy Higgins attended the Law and Society Annual meeting in Toronto, Canada, where she organized

and chaired a panel concerning feminism and sociobiology. She also gave a lecture on Women's Right's as Human Rights at the Amnesty International Annual Meeting.

Professor Hugh Hansen was the director of the School's Third Annual Conference on International Intellectual Property Law and Policy. Professor Roger Goebel gave a number of speeches in Europe during the last year, which included "An American Legal Critique of EC Company Law Harmonization," delivered at the Europa Institute in Saarbrucken, Germany. During this period he also occupied the Jean Monnet Professorship by designation of the European Community.

Professor Carl Felsenfeld was appointed as Advisor to the ALI International Insolvency Project, designed to work with similar delegations from Canada and Mexico to reconcile the bankruptcy law of the three countries under the North Atlantic Free Trade Agreement. Professor Martin Flaherty continued his human rights work for the Lawyers Committee for Human Rights, focusing on the intimidation of defense lawyers by the security forces in Northern Ireland. Much of this work involved a close working relationship with Michael Posner, the Committee's Executive Director, and Judge John J. Gibbons.

Judicial Service

Several members of the faculty served on important committees of the Judiciary during the past year. Martin Fogelman continued his appointment as Special Mediator for the Disciplinary Committee of the First Department of the New York State Supreme Court. Professor David Schmudde was appointed as a mediator for the U.S. District Court in the Southern District of New York and mediated five cases. Professor Carl Felsenfeld was nominated by New York State Chief

Judge Judith Kaye to the Board of Directors on the Interest on Lawyer Account Fund of the State of New York.

Professor Jacqueline Nolan-Haley assisted in conducting mediation training for the new mediation program in United States Bankruptcy Court and was also a member of the Alternative Dispute Resolution Project for the New York State court system. Professor Georgene Vairo



continued her appointment as chairperson on the Dalkon Shield Claimants Trust. Professor Katsoris continues his work as one of the three original public members of the Securities Industry Conference on Arbitration (SICA) and as a Private Judge at Duke Law School's Private Adjudication Center.

Organized Bar Activities

The Law School was well-represented this year in leadership positions in the organized bar. Professor Daniel Richman was a member of both the Criminal Advocacy Committee, for which he organized a panel discussion on indigent representation, and the Ad Hoc Committee to Commemorate Thurgood Marshall—for whom he clerked—for the Association of the Bar of the City of New York. Professor Joseph Perillo was a member of the ABA Task Force on Revision of UCC Article 2.

Professor Dan Capra chaired the Association of the Bar of the City of New York's Committee on Federal Legislation. Professor Mary Daly was the reporter for the New York State Bar Association Task Force on the Profession. Professor Maria Marcus was elected Vice President of the Association of the Bar of the City of New York.

Pro Bono Services

We are particularly proud that during the last year our faculty continued to reach out to the less fortunate. Professor Michael Madison continued his work helping indigent clients with landlord tenant problems on a pro-bono basis. Professor Donald Magnetti continued to assist the terminally ill by working on drafting wills and health care proxies. Professor David Schmudde spent one week in Columbia, South Carolina, building a home with law students for Habitat for Humanity—of which he is on the board of directors.

Graduate Program

Professors Carl Felsenfeld and Steve Thel have assumed the directorship of the Graduate Program, succeeding Professor Michael P.F. Malloy. Last year forty-three students were enrolled in the Program: fifteen pursuing the LL.M. in Banking, Corporate and Finance Law and twenty-eight working toward LL.M.s in International Business and Trade Law.



The 1994/95 Graduate Colloquium focused on "Financial Services Regulation at Mid-Decade" with Professor Michael Malloy, Professor Saul J. Cohen, of our adjunct faculty, and Professor Joel

Seligman of the University of Michigan, each presenting papers that will be published in the annual colloquium edition of the *Fordham Law Review*.

Lectures and Special Programs

The 1994/95 school year was also memorable for the many important lectures and programs held at the School. The most special of these was the annual John M. Sonnett Memorial Lecture delivered by former Chief Justice Warren E. Burger. It is always an honor for a person of the Chief Justice's stature to come to the School, but this lecture was of historical significance because it was the last public speech by the Chief Justice before his death this past summer. His speech on the decline of professionalism appears in Volume LXIII of the Fordham Law Review, at page 949.



Our Robert L. Levine Distinguished Lecture Series brought two outstanding jurists and a nationally-prominent law professor to the School. Judge John T. Noonan, Jr. of the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit spoke on "The First Amendment Abroad: The American Example of Religious Freedom," and Leon A. Higginbotham, Jr. Chief Judge Emeritus of the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit, spoke on "The Supreme Court's Anti-Political Apartheid Syndrome: A Mystique of Good Intentions with Devastating Racial Consequences." Professor Kathleen M. Sullivan of Stanford Law School spoke on "Resurrecting Free Speech."

Fordham Law Review revived under guidance of Professor Walter B. Kennedy Other distinguished addresses this past year were given at our Annual Law Day Luncheon, where United States District Court Judge Kevin Thomas Duffy delivered an important speech on the need



for values within the legal profession, and at the Fordham Law Review Alumni Association Dinner, where Denis M. McInerney spoke eloquently on maintaining a level of professionalism in the legal community. These addresses appeared in the New York Law Journal and were reprinted in the most recent Fordham Lawyer.

The School also hosted a number of special events during the year, including a conference on malpractice and ethics and a symposium on battered women. We also hosted a lunch in honor of John Hume, whose work for peace in Northern Ireland has been universally applauded.

Alumni Events and Special Recognition

Financial Aid Director James A. McGough received the 1995 Eugene Keefe Award from the Student Bar Association. Professor Constantine Katsoris was the recipient of this year's medal of achieve-

ment of the Fordham Law Alumni Association at the Annual Luncheon. Professor Katsoris has devoted himself to Fordham, inside and outside the classroom, for over 30 years. He is a member of the faculty who is asked about fondly by alumni from every generation.

We were especially pleased with the increase in reunion activity for the 5-year classes. Receptions and dinners have been held in the Platt Atrium for classes back to 1950, and they have proven to be successful and joyous occasions. Our Corporate Counsel Association for alumni who work in a non-law firm environment has been very successful under the leadership of Joseph E. Geoghan '64 and Paul Soden '68. Their new annual dinner tradition, held at the Yale Club, has proven to be very popular.

New Full-time Faculty Appointments

The Law School has appointed three new members to the full-time faculty, and welcomed for the fall semester a distinguished visiting professor.

Associate Professor of Law Elizabeth B. Cooper is a graduate of New York University School of Law, where she was a Root-Tilden Scholar and an editor of the *Annual Survey of American Law*. She graduated magna cum laude from the University of Pennsylvania with a degree in Asian and Middle Eastern Studies. Professor Cooper served as a law clerk to United States District Court Judge Anne E. Thompson (1988–90) and subsequently served as a Skadden Fellow/Staff Counsel for the ACLU Aids Project in New York City (1990–92). From 1992 to 1994 she was a Gibbons Fellow in Public Interest and Constitutional Law with the New Jersey firm of Crummy, Del Deo, Dolan, Griffinger & Vecchione, while also serving as an Adjunct Clinical Professor in the Constitutional Litigation Clinic at Rutgers University School of Law in Newark. She has also served as Clinical Instructor in the Federal Litigation Clinic at Brooklyn Law School. She teaches Litigation Skills.

Associate Professor Mark R. Patterson is a graduate of Stanford Law School. He holds B.S. (summa cum laude) and M.S. degrees in electrical engineering from The Ohio State University, where he was a National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellow. Professor Patterson was an associate with the Boston firm of Choate, Hall & Stewart, concentrating in antitrust and intellectual property litigation (1991–93). From 1993 to 1994, he served as a law clerk to Justice John M. Greaney of the Supreme Judicial Court of Massachusetts, and before joining the Fordham faculty, he was a Harry A. Bigelow Teaching Fellow and Lecturer at the University of Chicago Law School (1994–95). He teaches Antitrust and Corporations.

Associate Professor Benjamin C. Zipursky is a magna cum laude graduate of New York University School of Law, where he was a member of the Order of the Coif and an editor of the New York University Law Review. He holds a B.A. from Swarthmore College and an M.A. and Ph.D. in philosophy from the University of Pittsburgh. Professor Zipursky served as a law clerk to Judge Kimba

Michael M. Martin, a member of our faculty since 1972, has become our new Associate Dean. He is a graduate of the University of Iowa and its Law School, where he was Editor-in-Chief of the Iowa Law Review. He is a Rhodes Scholar and holds a B.Litt. in Law from Oxford University.

In 1968–69, he was a Bigelow Teaching Fellow at the University of Chicago. From 1969–72 he served as an Assistant Professor at the University of Washington, and in the 1979–80 academic year he was a Visiting Professor at the University of Virginia Law School.

Dean Martin is the author of the Federal Rules of Evidence Manual (Michie 6th ed. 1994 with S. Saltzburg and D. Capra), Morgan's Basic Problems of Evidence (ALI-ABA, 6th ed. 1988), and The Attorney Client Privilege and the Work-Product Doctrine (ABA Litigation Section, 2d ed. 1989 with E. Epstein). He also writes a bi-monthly column on "Evidence" in the New York Law Journal.

The 1994/95 school year was also an occasion to thank Georgene Vairo for her seven years of exemplary, truly exceptional service as Associate Dean. There was hardly an area of the School on which she did not have an impact. Recruitment of new faculty, expansion of technology at the School, establishment of the LL.M. program, renovation of the physical plant, and handling of the 75th Anniversary Celebration of Women Graduates were some of the areas where she left her mark and earned the gratitude of every part of the community. We will never forget her service as Associate Dean.



Career Planning and Placement

The Career Planning Center, led ably by Assistant Dean Kathleen Brady who serves this year as president of the National Association of Law Placement, continued its hard work on behalf of our students and alumni. In an attempt to keep one step ahead of the changeable job market, several new initiatives were added to our already extensive list of programs and services. The most notable change was the addition of a new career counselor, Emily Marcus, who will help the Center meet the increased demand for individual counseling appointments and design effective strategies to increase the number of Law School graduates securing judicial clerkships.



Student participation in the Center's various services and counseling programs was extremely high. Approximately 600 hours were dedicated to individual counseling appointments for both students and alumni. Career counseling served our community in such areas as skills identification, resume preparation, and interviewing techniques. Drop-in hours were held four days a week so that students and alumni could stop by with quick questions rather than having to wait for an appointment. Over 600 hours were dedicated to Drop-Ins, and nearly fifty appointments were scheduled for the mock interview program.

In addition to our regular on-campus interview process, close to 6500 positions were advertised by the Center via a computerized database. This is nearly doubled the number of listings during the previous year.

Kissam Law Library



Under the leadership of Professor Janet Tracy, the Library technology area made dramatic strides in 1994/95. The Library installed the last major module of the Innovative Interfaces on-line library system, which allows for the charging of books by using bar codes. It also purchased a new minicomputer, providing a link between our catalog and those of the law libraries of Columbia, NYU, the University of Pennsylvania, and Yale.

Our most recent project involved a complete renovation of the Kissam Library's sixth floor reading room, along with its adjoining computer labratory and classrooms. The upper reading room has been transformed into a beautiful space furnished with brand new tables and carrels in dark cherry wood veneers. Its remarkable decor is complemented by the installation of electrical equipment and computer hardware that allows our students to access sophisticated software programs from their individual study spaces, while enabling the Library to make the most efficient use of its available space.

Business and Tax Faculty

Throughout the Law School's history, we have been blessed by an outstanding faculty in the areas of business and taxation. Their role grows even more significant as the practice of law is increasingly influenced by business and economic factors, while becoming more international in nature.

To meet these challenges the faculty has increased the number of tax and business courses, with the result that there are now more than 60 electives offered in these two areas. In addition, the School has recently established a cooperative program with the Graduate School of Business

At the heart of our excellent programs in business and tax is our outstanding faculty, which provides the high quality legal education for our students that has been a hallmark of our School. The profiles that follow demonstrate the broad range of our faculty's many interests, the depth and diversity of its scholarship, and the outstanding service and leadership that it provides to our School and community.

Professor Yung Frank Chiang has been a member of the Fordham faculty since 1972. He attended National Taiwan University, receiving his law degree in 1958. He subsequently earned an LL.M. from Northwestern University in 1962 and a J.D. from the University of Chicago in 1965. Following graduation, he served as a research associate at Harvard University and as an assistant professor of law at the University of Georgia.

During summer 1994, Professor Chiang was selected by the American People Ambassador Program to lead a "People to Study People Mission" to China. He is also listed in the American Biography Institute's 1995 *International Book of Honor*, being one of only 500 people throughout the world to receive this distinction.

Professor Chiang's principal subjects include Civil Law System, Commercial Transactions, Commercial Paper, Comparative Law, Commercial Financing, Far Eastern Contract Law, and Trade with Asian Nations.

Associate Professor Jeffrey M. Colon is a graduate of the Yale Law School. He is a summa cum laude graduate of Yale College, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He also holds a master's degree in taxation from Georgetown University Law Center. He is currently serving on the Committee of Taxation of International Transactions of the Association of the Bar of the City of New York.

Professor Colon was formerly associated with the firms of Groom & Nordberg (1991–1994) and Cole Corette & Abrutyn (1989–1991) in Washington, D.C., where he concentrated in internation-

Library consists of 30,000 volumes. al and domestic taxation. He also has substantial knowledge of Latin America, having worked as an attorney in Venezuela, Mexico, and Brazil. His principal subjects include income taxation, with a particular emphasis on the U.S. taxation of international transactions.

Professor Carl Felsenfeld joined the Fordham Law faculty in 1984 and concentrates in the regulation of banks and other financial institutions. He has taught, written and lectured extensively in this field and participated actively in many of the recent changes in the laws governing the financial industry. He was a charter member of the Federal Reserve Consumer Advisory Council and is a delegate to the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law. In addition to his teaching duties, Professor Felsenfeld is Co-Director of the Master of Laws Program.

During his eleven years at Citicorp, before his appointment at Fordham, Professor Felsenfeld was the senior lawyer for both its Consumer Finance and its domestic Corporate Finance Groups. In these capacities, his functions included legal support in connection with Citicorp's interstate expansions and new product developments. He also worked closely with bank regulators and legislators on both the national and state levels.

Professor Felsenfeld was principally responsible for Citibank's "plain English" forms in 1975, a legal breakthrough that resulted in laws mandating clearly written consumer-related forms in New York and other states. He has co-authored two books on writing legal concepts so that they can be understood by laymen.

More recently, Professor Felsenfeld has become involved in electronic banking issues. He has been an Advisor to the project to write a uniform domestic law on electronic funds transfers and is a Representative to the United Nations project to legislate on international transfers. He has also written a book, "Legal Aspects of Electronic Funds Transfers." Professor Felsenfeld is a graduate of Dartmouth College and the Columbia Law School. ■

Professor Jill E. Fisch has been a member of the Fordham Law faculty since 1989. She received her B.A. from Cornell University, in 1982, from which she graduated cum laude in mathematics and with distinction in all subjects. 



Professor Roger J. Goebel is Director of Fordham Law School's Center on EuropeanCommunity Law and International Antitrust. He is a noted authority on laws of the European Community, and his Cases on European Community Law (co-authored with Bermann, Davey & Fox), is used in over 65 U.S. and Canadian law schools.

Professor Goebel was appointed to the prestigious Jean Monnet Chair in European Union Law at Bonn University (spring 1995) and also named as a recipient of a 1995 Fulbright Research Grant to explore the impact which the addition of new member states will have on the European Union.





Our tax and business faculty has been complemented by several distinguished professors who have been part of our community, through frequent visits, during the last few years. These faculty members include Professors Victor Brudney, a member of the Harvard Law School faculty for over twenty years; Whitmore Gray, Emeritus Professor of Law, University of Michigan; and Valentine Korah, Emeritus Professor of Competition Law, University College, London.

Clinical Faculty

To meet the growing need for lawyering skills such as fact analysis, interviewing, counseling, negotiation, witness examination, and argument, the Law School has expanded its clinical course offerings and programs. Last year we added a Domestic Violence Clinic in which students represent survivors of domestic abuse, and increased the variety of cases that are studied in our Litigation Skills course.

This year, for the first time, our students are assisting clients with regard to Social Security benefits, and we are exploring the possibility of taking employment discrimination cases. We are also expermenting with new, basic lawyering-skills courses such as "A Lawyering Approach to Administrative Law," where students represent clients, in simulation, from the initial interview to an appeal before the District Court.

The Clinical Program has drawn a great deal of praise from our students and the community. Critical to its success has been the leadership and dedication of our clinical professors, and it is therefore a pleasure for me to highlight them in the following profiles.

She was an assistant professor in the Economics Department at Hunter College (1983–86) and served as an Assistant District Attorney in Boston, Massachusetts (1975–76).

She has served as a member of the Professional Ethics Committee of the New York County Lawyer's Association (1984–86) and the Unauthorized Practice of Law Committee of the New York State Bar Association (1987–89). She also serves as an editorial board member of *Mediation Quarterly*.

Associate Professor of Law Ian Weinstein is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Reed College (B.A. 1981). He also holds a J.D. (1986) from New York University School of Law and an LL.M. (1990) from Georgetown University, where he was Stuart Stiller/E. Barret Prettyman Fellow in the Criminal Justice Clinic.

Prior to joining the Fordham Law faculty in 1991, Professor Weinstein was an associate attorney with the Federal Defender Services Unit of the Legal Aid Society for the Southern District of New York. He has conducted jury trials and supervised law student clinicians in the District of Columbia Superior Court and the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York. He has also prepared briefs and argued appeals in the Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia and the United States Court of Appeals for the Second and Eighth Circuits. He has written on federal criminal practice and is a member of the Committee on Science and Law of the Association of the Bar of the City of New York.

In addition to supervising students in Fordham's live-client clinic, Professor Weinstein supervises Judicial Externships and has taught in the first-year Lawyering Skills Program. His principal subjects include Lawyering Skills, Litigation Skills, and a Judicial Seminar.

The most recent addition to our clinical faculty is Associate Professor of Law Elizabeth Cooper, who is profiled above along with other new appointments to the full-time faculty. We have also appointed Keri Gould as director of our Externship Programs. She was formerly an associate professor of law at the University of Utah College of Law and the director of externship programs at New York Law School. adjunct faculty who heads our Domestic Violence Clinic. As you may be aware, Professor Jones is a frequent commentator on legal matters for Court TV and CBS.

The work of our Clinical faculty is complemented by the members of our Lawyering Skills program: Ann Moynihan, Ted Neustadt, and Thane Rosenbaum. The Program is headed by Professor Rachel Vorspan, who also directs our legal writing program, and teaches our students the basic techniques of interviewing, negotiation, counseling, and witness examination. The Clinical Program is enriched further by our excellent legal writing faculty which includes Adjunct Professors Margaret Sandercock, Tina Stark, Arnold Cohen, Clement Berne, Laurie Basch, Robert Feinberg, Eric Corngold, Shirley Schaeffer, James Cott, and Francine Alfandry, who teach courses in drafting and advanced legal writing. It is further enhanced by our first-year legal writing adjunct professors, who include Elizabeth Bernhardt, Frances K. Browne, Hon. Denny Chin, Elizabeth Ferguson, Lawrence Gerzog, William Hoffman, Sr. Bernadette Kenny, Michael Lane, Richard Mark, Ann Moynihan, Deborah Peters, Thane Rosenbaum, Francine Alfandry, Margaret Sandercock, Edward Scarvalone, Gideon Schor, Allan Taffet, John Tsavaris, Fr. Whelan, Mary Ann Wirth, and James Yellen. Collectively, they have made our legal writing program one of the finest in the country.

Public Interest Activities

Of the many areas that have undergone considerable evolution during the past decade, the public service activities of our students rank among the most inspiring. This last year some 700 members of our student body—more than half of the School's enrollment—engaged in some form of public service through the offices of our Public Interest Resource Center. As we mark our 90th year, I would like to share with you some of the many pro bono activities of our students, which eloquently pay tribute to the theme of this anniversary year: "Fordham Law—In the Service of Others."

Public Interest Resource Center

The Public Interest Resource Center (PIRC), under the direction of Thomas Schoenherr and now in its fifth year, moved into new and expanded office space in 1994/95 and added a third member to its administrative staff. With these new facilities, the Center has been able to inaugurate additional student organizations: an Unemployment Action Center, which trains students to represent individuals at unemployment insurance hearings; a Housing Advocacy Project, where our students defend the rights of low-income tenants in New York City public housing; and the Family Court Mediation Project, directed by Professor Jacqueline Nolan-Haley, where students conduct mediation sessions concerning disputes of visitation and custody issues.

The PIRC's Fordham Student Sponsored Fellowship, now in its eighth year, continues to build on its remarkable record of achievement, and this year was recognized as the first recipient of the Outstanding Achievement Award from the National Association for Public Interest Law. This is the third year in a row that the Center has been honored by this national organization. Through the generosity of alumni and friends, the FSSF also raised nearly \$148,000 which allowed the funding of 37 students who worked in public interest settings this past summer.

Other significant activities of the PIRC includes the Community Service Project, which sent 40 of our law students to tutor students at Martin Luther King, Jr. High School; the Battered Women's Advocacy Project, which trained over 50 students to assist battered women in Family Court hearings; and the Pro Bono Students America, which continued to offer our students the opportunity to volunteer their services in the areas of civil rights, the environment, criminal law, poverty law, and the rights of children, the elderly, and battered women.

Stein Scholars Program

The Stein Center for Ethics and Public Interest Law completed its third successful year overseeing the Stein Scholars Program, which numbered 55 (including 13 in the graduating class). Twenty-four new Stein Scholars were selected this summer.

(continued) Among the highlights of the year were a series of eight roundtable discussions among students, faculty, and practitioners involved in public interest law. Some of the topics discussed include "Lawyering for the Homeless," "Litigating Against the Death Penalty...," "The Ethics of Public Interest Lawyers...," "Government Lawyers' Ethics...," and "Human Rights in South Africa." The Stein Scholars also participated in several conferences that were co-sponsored by our Stein Center, including a three-day conference addressing "Ethical Issues in Representing Older Clients;" a one day program on "Serving Clients Well: Avoiding Malpractice and Ethical Pitfalls in the Practice of Law," and a panel discussion on "Problems and Solutions: Addressing the Needs of New York's Homeless Mentally Ill."

A Helping Hand

The School has been helped by the leadership and generosity of its alumni throughout its entire history, and this year was no exception as graduates made truly extraordinary contributions to the School, insuring its future and providing important examples to others. 1994/95 was the most successful in the history of the Law School in terms of annual giving, which reached an all-time high of close to \$4 million. I thank all of you very, very much, and offer my special thanks to several graduates for lifting the School to newer and greater heights.

We are especially grateful to the alumni leaders of our different programs: Maureen Scannell Bateman '68, chair of the annual fund; Denis M. McInerney '51, chair of our capital campaign; George C. Ross '66, chair of the Mulligan Chair and Committee; and Timothy J. Brosnan '84, chair of our committee covering graduates from 1984 to 1994. Behind all of these efforts has been the incredible, selfless leadership of Michael K. Stanton '59, president of our alumni association.






