ProView eBooks

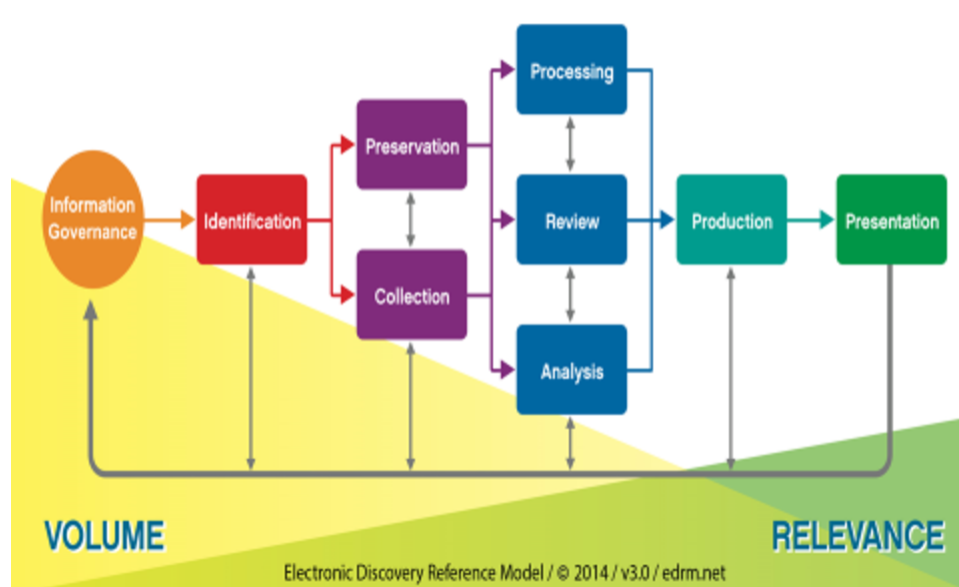
The Fordham Law community now has access to the **Thomson Reuters (West) ProView eBooks** platform. The resource can be accessed via IP authentication, from on-campus or off-campus using your Fordham

login. ProView offers nearly 200 Thomson Reuters titles on topics ranging from Intellectual Property Law to Administrative Law, organized for simple browsing and searching, as well as reading on a desktop or mobile device. These titles can be annotated and highlighted as you read within the platform, and exported as an annotated PDF file. The library gave an introduction to e-discovery last week. Students listened to a short lecture on the basics of the **Electronic Discovery Reference Model**. We also discussed how e-discovery fits into the overall litigation process. Next, students got a hands-on experience with an e-discovery platform. They were able to run searches and tag documents, similar to an actual document production. E-Discovery will be the topic of one of the sessions the library will offer to students as part of a broader program on the technology of legal practice next year.
