Rio, July 14, 1984

Dear Gerry:

I wonder if you will remmember me. I am and Sophomres together at Marymount School. In 1950 I left school to return home to Brazil.

When I read in the newspaper this morning that it was you who had been invited to run for the Vice-Presidency of the United States I was so thrilled that it is hard for you to imagine.

I have never been much of a correspondent and there are times when I have been sorry that I lost touch with everybody from Marymount. Then, all of a sudden, this wonderful news about you! I couldn't be happier!

As a matter of fact it was my father who called me up this morning, all excited, to tell me about you. He remmembered you from the time that he, my mother and my brothers went up to school and took us both out to dinner to that restaurant up on the hill _ I cannot remmember the name of it anymore. My father recalls you because you impressed him as being very lively and smart, so we are all, the entire family, very enthusiastic about your beautiful career.

In case you remmember me, let me fill you in breifly about what has been happening to me. About you, I have read a lot in the newspaper this morning. I have six children, four girls ages 21, 19, 18 and 4, and two boys, ages 17 and 11. Then he went on to his Ph.D. at UCLA and I stopped studying in order to bring up the family. Then I finally got my Doctorate in Philosophy in Rio where we are both traching in a private university.

But then there was an enormous snow storm on the day we arrived in New York and then we canceled our plans to visit Terrytown.
