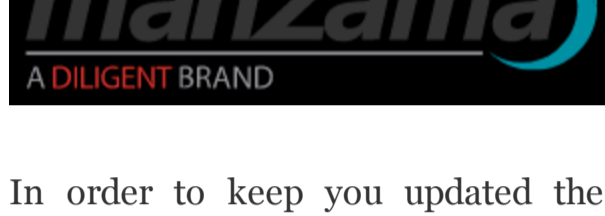

The Maloney Library has quickly transitioned to supporting our students' distance learning. Many of our resources were already available online including an extensive selection of [databases](#), [eBooks](#), and [journals](#). These materials support students writing papers and performing journal work and are available to all of the Fordham Law community.

In addition to online materials the Maloney Library already provided, we have acquired subscriptions to a number of student focused platforms that provide online access to casebooks and study aids. Casebooks published by Aspen, Carolina Academic Press, Lexis, West, and Wolters Kluwer are available to students, along with study aids, such as the popular Examples & Explanations, Nutshells, and many others. We have also made a copy of the official online Bluebook available to every student.

Manzama and COVID Update

In order to keep you updated the Maloney Library has created custom Manzama searches (topics) about how COVID-19 is impacting law schools and legal education. Narrowly tailored to create relevant results, these searches will keep you up to date about how our fellow institutions are weathering these trying times.

The new topic options are as follows:

1. **Coronavirus (COVID-19) & Law Schools** – This search is curated using Manzama's existing COVID-19 filter then specifically narrowed to address a Law School and higher education perspective.
2. **Remote Law School Education** – This search is designed to focus on how law schools are embracing remote education and the tools (Zoom, WebEx, Blackboard, etc.) required to execute remote classrooms. This search is not tethered to COVID-19, but will not exclude information related to it.

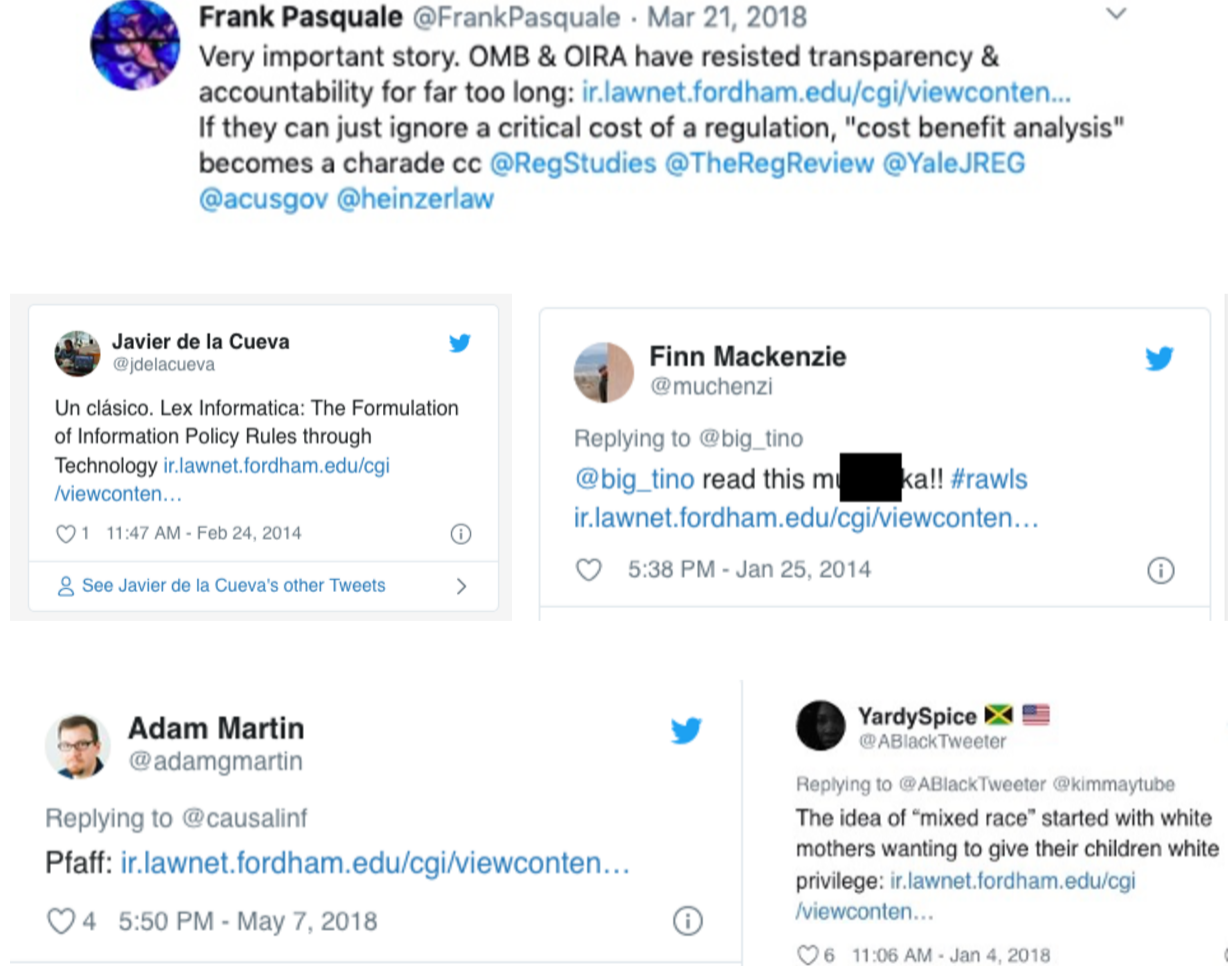

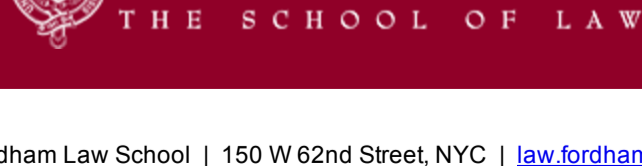
