Total Parole Board workload for August 2018 was 1,030 interviews, including 35 administrative hearings for rescission decisions, alternate date considerations, or special considerations. Initial appearances made up 70% of the Parole Board interviews for August 2018. The tables below summarize in detail Parole Board activity for the month.

Table 3 shows that during the first eight months of 2018, the Board of Parole and the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision made determinations on 7,584 cases that were eligible for release to parole supervision. This was a decrease of 912 cases (-10.7%) compared to the first eight months of 2017. Of the 7,584 cases reviewed during the first eight months of 2018, 3,457 (45.6%) were approved for release. This rate of approval is 15.5% higher than the first eight months of 2017 when 2,559 (30.1%) of the 8,496 reported parole eligible cases were approved for release.

According to Table 4, there were 5,377 Initial appearances reported for the first eight months of 2018. This was 13.7% lower than the 6,228 reported for the first seven months of 2017 (see Table 5). The 47.9% approval rate for Initial interviews during the first eight months of 2018 was 17.8% higher than the 30.1% reported for the same time period in 2017.

The 2,207 Reappearances reported for the first eight months of 2018 were 2.7% lower than the 2,268 reported in the first eight months of 2017. The approval rate for Reappearances during the first eight months of 2018 was 40.0%, compared to 30.2% during the same time period in 2017, an increase of 9.8%.

Total Parole Board workload for February 2019 was 958 interviews, including 32 administrative hearings for rescission decisions, alternate date considerations, or special considerations. Table 3 shows that during the first two months of 2019, the Board of Parole and the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision made determinations on 1,873 cases that were eligible for release to parole supervision. This was a decrease of 45 cases (-2.3%) compared to the first two months of 2018. Of the 1,873 cases reviewed during the first two months of 2019, 768 (41.0%) were approved for release. This rate of approval is 2.8% lower than the first two months of 2018, when 840 (43.8%) of the 1,918 reported parole eligible cases were approved for release.

According to Table 4, there were 1,310 Initial appearances reported for the first two months of 2019. This was 5.0% lower than the 1,379 reported for the first two months of 2018 (see Table 5). The 43.1% approval rate for Initial interviews during the first two months of 2019 was 2.2% lower than the 45.3% reported for the same time period in 2018.

The 563 Reappearances reported for the first two months of 2019 was 4.5% higher than the 539 reported for the same time period of 2018. The approval rate for Reappearances during the first two months of 2019 was 36.2%, compared to 40.1% during the same time period in 2018, a decrease of 3.9%.

Table 3 shows that during the first month of 2019, the Board of Parole and the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision made determinations on 943 cases that were eligible for release to parole supervision. This was a decrease of 20 cases (-2.1%) compared to the first month of 2018. Of the 943 cases reviewed during the first month of 2019, 392 (41.6%) were approved for release. This rate of approval is the same as the first month of 2018 when 401 (41.6%) of the 963 reported parole eligible cases were approved for release.

According to Table 4, there were 659 Initial appearances reported for the first month of 2019. This was 3.7% lower than the 684 reported for the first month of 2018 (see Table 5). The 43.9% approval rate for Initial interviews during the first month of 2019 was 0.3% higher than the 43.6% reported for the same time period in 2018.

The 284 Reappearances reported for the first month of 2019 was consistent with the 279 reported in the first month of 2018. The approval rate for Reappearances during the first month of 2019 was 36.3%, compared to 36.9% during the same time period in 2018, a decrease of 0.6%.

Table 3 shows that during the first seven months of 2018, the Board of Parole and the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision made determinations on 6,589 cases that were eligible for release to parole supervision. This was a decrease of 798 cases (-10.8%) compared to the first seven months of 2017. Of the 6.589 cases reviewed during the first seven months of 2018, 3,026 (45.9%) were approved for release. This rate of approval is 16.3% higher than the first seven months of 2017 when 2,190 (29.6%) of the 7,387 reported parole eligible cases were approved for release.

According to Table 4, there were 4,685 Initial appearances reported for the first seven months of 2018. This was 13.6% lower than the 5,424 reported for the first seven months of 2018 (see Table 5). The 48.1% approval rate for Initial interviews during the first seven months of 2018 was 18.7% higher than the 29.4% reported for the same time period in 2017.

The 1,904 Reappearances reported for the first seven months of 2018 were 3.0% lower than the 1,963 reported in the first seven months of 2017. The approval rate for Reappearances during the first seven months of 2018 was 40.7%, compared to 30.4% during the same time period in 2017, an increase of 10.3%.

Table 3 shows that during the first six months of 2018, the Board of Parole and the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision made determinations on 5,741 cases that were eligible for release to parole supervision. This was a decrease of 566 cases (-8.9%) compared to the first six months of 2017. Of the 5,741 cases reviewed during the first six months of 2018, 2,651 (46.2%) were approved for release. This rate of approval is 16.9% higher than the first six months of 2017 when 1,850 (29.3%) of the 6,307 reported parole eligible cases were approved for release.

Table 3 shows that during the first eleven months of 2018, the Board of Parole and the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision made determinations on 10,435 cases that were eligible for release to parole supervision. This was a decrease of 1,021 cases (-8.9%) compared to the first eleven months of 2017. Of the 10,435 cases reviewed during the first eleven months of 2018, 4,651 (44.6%) were approved for release. This rate of approval is 12.5% higher than the first eleven months of 2017 when 3,672 (32.1%) of the 11,456 reported parole eligible cases were approved for release.

According to Table 4, there were 7,338 Initial appearances reported for the first eleven months of 2018. This was 11.9% lower than the 8,325 reported for the first eleven months of 2017 (see Table 5). The 47.2% approval rate for Initial interviews during the first eleven months of 2018 was 15.1% higher than the 32.1% reported for the same time period in 2017.

The 3,097 Reappearances reported for the first eleven months of 2018 were 1.1% lower than the 3,131 reported in the first eleven months of 2017. The approval rate for Reappearances during the first eleven months of 2018 was 38.4%, compared to 32.0% during the same time period in 2017, an increase of 6.4%.

Total Parole Board workload for October 2018 was 949 interviews, including 11 administrative hearings for rescission decisions, alternate date considerations, or special considerations. Initial appearances made up 68% of the Parole Board interviews for October 2018. The tables below summarize in detail Parole Board activity for the month.

Table 3 shows that during the first ten months of 2018, the Board of Parole and the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision made determinations on 9,461 cases that were eligible for release to parole supervision. This was a decrease of 1,032 cases (-9.8%) compared to the first ten months of 2017. Of the 9,461 cases reviewed during the first ten months of 2018, 4,214 (44.5%) were approved for release. This rate of approval is 13.4% higher than the first ten months of 2017 when 3,262 (31.1%) of the 10,493 reported parole eligible cases were approved for release.

According to Table 4, there were 6,664 Initial appearances reported for the first ten months of 2018. This was 12.8% lower than the 7,643 reported for the first ten months of 2017 (see Table 5). The 47.2% approval rate for Initial interviews during the first ten months of 2018 was 16.0% higher than the 31.2% reported for the same time period in 2017.

The 2,797 Reappearances reported for the first ten months of 2018 were 1.9% lower than the 2,850 reported in the first ten months of 2017. The approval rate for Reappearances during the first ten months of 2018 was 38.3%, compared to 30.9% during the same time period in 2017, an increase of 7.4%.
