



The Maloney Library has created your Hein Author Profile and Hein has automatically linked it, based on your name and name variations, to all of your scholarship published in journals held in HeinOnline. But you are the best person to

evaluate whether anything in your Author Profile is missing. The library is preparing a list of all writings of any kind that are missing from your Hein Author Profile. In the next week or two, please look at your **HeinOnline profile** and notify your library liaison of what is missing with a cc to Jae Lee. Please note that HeinOnline is primarily a repository of legal scholarship published in U.S.-

based law journals. At this time HeinOnline Author Profiles do not list books, book chapters, online articles, non-legal periodical articles, popular press materials, or

newspaper articles and op-eds. Thanks for your crucial assistance in ensuring that Fordham Law is ranked as highly as it deserves in U.S. News' new scholarly impact rankings.
