U.S. News is working with HeinOnline, the leading online distributor of U.S. law journal content in full-text, to use the Author Profiles on HeinOnline to calculate and rank law school scholarly impact by institution. U.S. News is planning to publish this ranking in the coming year.

The Maloney Library has created your Hein Author Profile and Hein has automatically linked it, based on your name and name variations, to all of your scholarship published in journals held in HeinOnline. But you are the best person to evaluate whether anything in your Author Profile is missing.

The library is preparing a list of all writings of any kind that are missing from your Hein Author Profile. In the next week or two, please look at your **HeinOnline profile** and notify your library liaison of what is missing with a cc to Jae Lee. Please note that HeinOnline is primarily a repository of legal scholarship published in U.S.-based law journals. At this time HeinOnline Author Profiles do not list books, book chapters, online articles, non-legal periodical articles, popular press materials, or newspaper articles and op-eds.

Thanks for your crucial assistance in ensuring that Fordham Law is ranked as highly as it deserves in U.S. News' new scholarly impact rankings.

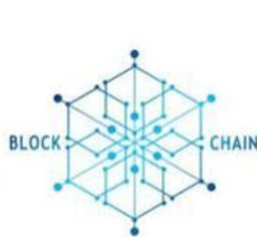

Posting your article to FLASH and SSRN is as easy as 1-2-3!

1. Send Carlie McCarthy (cmccarthy@law.fordham.edu) the article in Word or pdf format, with an abstract in Word, and the citation.
2. For SSRN, your article can be placed in a maximum of 12 ejournals. Carlie will send you the list to choose from and add to the submission. The article will be public immediately after submission.
3. Joel Veloz (jveloz@law.fordham.edu) in our Circulation department will post the article to FLASH.

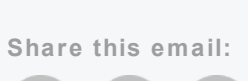
And you are done! You will receive an email from SSRN once the submission has been approved, containing a link to the article.
