Researching Treaties?

To research treaties, one of the best starting points is a type of book called a commentary, which provides discussion and further resources article-by-article; to find these books or similar articles, search the [library catalog](#) for the name of the treaty plus the word "commentary." To find the text of treaties, it depends on the date. If you're interested in historical materials, use the [World Treaty Library](#) from HeinOnline to read treaties from 1648 to the present plus related articles. (The Treaty Library provides an index for navigating - just like the print!). For more current events, the [United Nations Treaty Collection](#) is best for text but lacks in search features and usability. (A common theme among treaty resources!)
