Dear Future Vice-President:

You could recapture now some of the lost magic of your campaign by initiating some woman-to-woman dialog with women leaders in other countries, via TV, or on a brief trip overseas to see Mrs. Thatcher, Indira Gandhi and others.

This could also weaken the criticism against you that you lack foreign policy experience.

Proposing woman-to-woman conversations with Russian women political leaders would also expose the weakness of their revolutionary appeal in the third world, for where are the women in the politboro?

One issue to talk about: the ignored holocaust of 14,000,000 children a year dying of hunger and disease unnecessarily -- 140,000,000 in 10 years, far more terrible than what Hitler did to the Jews. What do women propose to do about this? Are they more caring of other people's children?" Even in the USA the current interest in child abuse is really part of the larger question of who cares about other people's children, and the child abuse question cannot be separated -- as Reagan would do -- from larger issues of child care, including the elimination of funds for therapy for abused children.

This letter needs no reply, but merely is a suggestion that might help you win the election.
