Library Now Purchasing Required Casebooks for Course Reserves

Because of the outrageous cost of casebooks and in the service of equity, the Maloney Library is now purchasing one copy of the required casebook for each 1L course, for required upper-level courses, and for courses tested on the New York Bar Exam, and is making them available to students for two-hour borrowing through our Course Reserves collection.

Here are the current statistics on course reserve lending:

- 30 titles purchased.
- 26 titles (87%) have had at least 1 check out.
- 156 checkouts for all titles.

Oxford Scholarly Authorities on International Law

The law library now has access to [Oxford Scholarly Authorities on International Law](#) (OSAIL). This platform gives us full-text access to ebooks from Oxford on international law that are not on other online platforms and have limited availability in print, including Brownlie, Oppenheim, and the Oxford Commentaries on International Law. The platform can be searched or browsed by title, author, and subject (plus the usual keyword searching) but is otherwise very basic.
