REFERENCE BY-THE-NUMBERS

Since August 1, 2022

- Reference librarians have assisted with 2,056 questions.
- 479 of those questions were from faculty and administrators.
- Of the 479 faculty and administrator questions asked, 112 required in-depth research taking more than an hour to complete.
- Reference librarians taught 28 sections of the 7-week introductory legal research class to first-year law students.
- Reference librarians taught 5 advanced legal research courses.

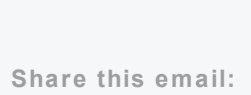

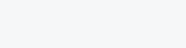
