The Maloney Law Library is migrating to a new library management system, Alma, and its public interface, Primo. For librarians, this will mean more efficient and rational backstage functionality. For students, scholars, and instructors, it will mean a cleaner, more legible interface and better presentation of and differentiation among material types and formats. Also, Alma handles electronic resources better than the system it replaces and is more actively developed and better supported by its vendor. Ultimately, these changes should result in an improved user experience and more rapid innovation as user needs evolve.

The library catalog you are familiar with will be available on the library home page through the fall semester and winter break. The library homepage will link to Primo when classes begin in the spring semester. Users new to Primo will have little trouble transitioning to the new interface, but we will schedule a hands-on orientation for interested faculty members in January.
