Dear Congresswoman Ferraro,

I just finished watching your
TV presentation 2:10pm 8/31/84.

You are indeed a fine human being. Knowing little about you prior to the convention, I have read about your life; listened to you speak and have come to several conclusions that I would like to share with you.

You are a warm, sensitive and bright person. I sense that you don't have a dishonest bone in your body. What you don't know, you are willing to learn. But those tiny details about accounting etc. you are wise enough to not learn but consult with someone who has spent their life learning.

It's a tough time for you right now as you graciously, but with strength implied during the interview today.

Yesterday, I was talking with

a friend of mine, an historian - I'm a professor. We agreed that the people of this country should be represented by intelligent, well trained, thoughtful, complete people. People who are sensitive to how the USA must become interdependent with the world - not dominate the world.

When you are elected - please continue to be straight forward and compassionate, analytical but intuitive, strong but gentle, cautious but open minded.

One last comment - my grandmother said to me once - " [redacted], let ~~the~~ ^{people} get to know you, trust you - and/or love you before you show them your impulsive nature."
