Re: New York Columbus Day Parade

Monday, October 8, 1984

Before the parade, you will be holding with Mondale, Moynihan, Cuomo, and Koch in the conference room of the Brownstone Studio at One East 43rd Street. You are scheduled to arrive there at 11:20 AM.

You will begin marching at 11:45 AM, starting at 43rd Street and 5th Avenue. You and Mondale are the guests of Governor Cuomo for the parade. Vice-President Bush will also be there as the guest of Senator D'Amato. Bush and D'Amato will be marching behind Sophia Loren, the Grand Marshall. You, Mondale, Cuomo, Koch, and Moynihan will be marching in front of the City Council and other elected officials.

During the parade, you will pass by St. Patrick's Cathedral between 50th and 51st Streets. Archbishop O'Connor will be seated outside the Cathedral. You will leave the parade for a moment to greet the Archbishop.

The reviewing stand will be between 67th & 69th Sts. You will walk past the reviewing stand.
