EXAMINATION BY COMMISSIONER ROSS:

- Q Good morning; are you
- A Yes.

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Q Hi, my name is Commissioner Ross. With me today is Commissioner Hernandez.

You are serving a sentence of twenty-five years to life for two counts of murder in the second degree. A six to twelve year sentence on a robbery, four counts of robbery in the first degree. Four and a half to nine on two counts of burglary in the second. And two to four on grand larceny charge; is that right?

- A Yes, ma'am.
- Q And this crime involved you with two codefendants killing, basically two women by shooting them. It looks like your codefendants also raped them. And you were basically the lookout on this?
 - A Yes, ma'am.
- Q Did you know these victims?
- 19 A No.
- 20 | O Did either of the codefendants know them?
- 21 A I have no idea, I don't think so.
 - Q Did you know they were going to get killed?
- 23 | A No.
 - Q Now it says there were four children in the house when this happened, where were they when all this was taking

place?

A From my knowledge, after I came out of the van and entered the house, when I entered the house, the kids was standing near the front door. And during the time when everything was taking place, the kids were standing with me at the front door.

- Q So they didn't see what was going on, basically?
- A From the time that I left the van and entered the home and saw the children standing at the door, they saw as much as I saw from the time that I had gotten there, from the van.
- Q So this was supposed to be a robbery or burglary that went bad?
 - A To my knowledge, yes.
 - Q And did you know the codefendants pretty well?
- A I knew one of them.
- Q Had you committed similar offenses with them before this?
 - A I knew (phonetic) back in the early '60's it was; I met him in the 1960's, early 1960's sometime.
 - Q Prior to this you had had a couple of misdemeanors basically, is that all?
- A Yes.

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- Q No felonies, right?
 - A No. I think I had one felony back in the --

1	Q Violation of a child and you got six years?
2	A No. Maybe six months.
3	Q Six years probation?
4	A In that sense, yes.
5	Q Was that basically failure to pay child support?
6	A So the mother claims.
7	Q Since you have been incarcerated, you have completed
8	all your programs?
9	A Yes, ma'am.
10	Q What are you doing now?
11	A I am a porter in the B Block housing unit.
12	Q You had a Tier III back in 2007?
13	A Yes.
14	Q That was for a weapon; what was that?
15	A They wrote it up as a weapon, but it was an
16	instrument that I used to tighten my eyeglasses, they used
17	wrote it up as a weapon. It was a very, very small object
18	that I used to tighten the screws on my eyeglasses and they
19	wrote it up as a weapon.
20	Q I see back in '07 you refused ART and ASAT; what was
21	the reason for that?
22	A It was, to my understanding, it was dealing with a
23	person that was affiliated with drugs. I don't have a drug
24	problem, I never had a drug problem. I thought it was all
25	about being addicted to drugs and one thing led to another.

1	And before I got more information about the program, that is
2	when I decided to take it.
3	Q Now, if you were to be released, where would you go?
4	A Where I would go, as far as living accommodations?
5	Q Yes.
6	A My mother's home.
7	Q Where is that?
8	A It's in
9	Q What would you do for work, what kind of work could
10	you do?
11	A Well, automotive. I went to trade school back in
12	the late '60's, early '70's, I went through a training process
13	of automotive. And, you know, since being incarcerated, I
14	have been reading and trying to keep up-to-date with the
15	current technology of automotive, as a mechanic.
16	Q Right, right. Okay; I have no further questions.
17	COMMISSIONER ROSS: Commissioner?
18	COMMISSIONER HERNANDEZ: I have no questions;
19	thank you.
20	Q Sir, anything you would like to add?
21	A Yes. If I could possibly change what happened in
22	the past, I would definitely, definitely wouldn't have made
23	the mistake that I made of being in the wrong place at the
24	wrong time, with the wrong people; as far as the outcome of
25	this crime.

I have to say that I am guilty to participation of what took place in this crime. As far as the murdering and the rapes, I am sorry that that happened; I had no knowledge of said crimes that were taking place until after the fact. I just regret, I regret what happened. If I could change what happened in the past, I would do it in the split second.

I thought that by saving the children's lives I thought I did something really, really major in saving those children's life. Because after I found out what had happened to their mothers, I couldn't stand there to see any harm being brought to those children. And that is why I stayed with those children.

COMMISSIONER ROSS: We will get back to you in a couple of days.

INMATE Thank you.

(After due deliberation by the Parole Board, the following Decision was rendered:)

DECISION

COMMISSIONER ROSS: Parole denied twenty-four months; next appearance will be 11/11.

Parole is denied.

After a careful review of your record, your personal interview and due deliberation, it is the determination of this Panel that, if released at this time, there is a reasonable probability that you would not live at

liberty without violating the laws.

Your release at this time is incompatible with

the welfare and safety of the community, and will so deprecate

the seriousness of this crime as to undermine respect for the

law.

This Decision is based upon the following factors: You stand convicted of the instant offenses of murder in the second degree, robbery in the first degree, burglary in the second degree and grand larceny auto in the third degree; in which you, along with two codefendants, murdered two women by shooting them. You then burglarized their home and stole personal property. These crimes occurred while there were four children, ages three to seven in the residence. These were heinous and violent crimes and demonstrated complete lack of respect for human life and lack of regard for the health and welfare of vulnerable, innocent

victims.
