BY COMMISSIONER DELEON: 1 2 Q. You are 3 A. Yes. Q. I'm Commissioner Deleon. This is 4 5 Commissioner Buchanan and Commissioner 6 Thomas. You are reappearing before the board 7 for release consideration, correct? A. Yes. Q. This is your third or actually your fourth 9 10 appearance before the board. Let me state that you initially went to the board in July 11 of 1988 and you were held 24 months. 12 came back July of 1990 and you were held 24 13 Last month, July of 1992, you saw 14 months. the Parole Board and your case was postponed 15 16 three months or earlier for clarification of records and you are now appearing before the 17 board? 18 A. Yes. 19 Q. Going back to the July, 1990 hold, do you 20 remember why you were held, sir? 21 22 A. Yes. 23 Q. Tell me why. A. The nature of the crime and they felt that I 24 should continue therapy. 25 DePaolo-Crosby Reporting Service

Q. The record indicates that you are continuing 1 to serve two concurrent sentences, nine to 2 life for murder in the second degree, and 3 three and a third to ten for sodomy in the 4 first degree, is that correct? 5 A. Yes. 7 Q. The panel said that your release would not be compatible with the welfare of society. It 8 would so deprecate the seriousness of your 9 10 crime, the sodomy and murder of an eight year old boy. They noted your positive 11 participation in the Merrill Cooper program 12 as well as prior participation in academic 13 and vocational programs. They asked you to 14 continue such participation in preparation 15 for your return to the community. 16 17 Because you were held 24 months we would like to go back and discuss the 18 incident. 19 20 A. Yes. Q. The record indicates that on or about 21 of 1979 in 22 23 you were at the time almost sixteen 24 years of age, correct? A. - 1 Q. You apparently were in the habit of playing
- with your neighbor who was eight years of
- age. At the time on this particular day you
- and he went out to play while in the woods.
- 5 You apparently struck him from behind with a
- 6 piece of wood?
- 7 A. Yes.
- 8 Q. You then sexually molested him and after
- 9 molesting him in order to prevent him from
- 10 telling his mother or anyone else about the
- 11 occurrence you proceeded to hang him from a
- 12 tree, correct?
- 13 A. Yes, ma'am.
- 14 Q. It says that you then left the body in the
- 15 woods, returned home for a length of rope.
- This was after you had sexually molested him
- 17 before you hung him?
- 18 A. I don't know. Is that the first report
- 19 you're reading? 1988 or 1990?
- 20 Q. 1988.
- 21 A. There is a slight --
- 22 Q. There is a difference?
- 23 A. Yes. There is a difference in the later
- 24 report.
- 25 Q. You tell me what happened.

- 1 A. I was really confused.
- Q. I understand one report says that you had the
- 3 rope with you?
- 4 A. No. That's not true. I went back for the
- 5 rope. The later report indicates that by my
- 6 own admission I strangled my victim before I
- 7 hung him. He was dead before I went back for
- 8 the rope.
- 9 Q. Tell me what happened. How could you become
- 10 involved in something like that?
- 11 A. I spent a lot of time talking about this when
- 12 I was at Merrill Cooper. It's a lot of
- things. It's not just one thing. When I was
- 14 15 years old I had a lot of problems. I had
- 15 sexual identity problems. I wasn't sure
- 16 about my sexuality.
- I was being molested myself which is
- 18 something I never dealt with.
- 19 Q. Now, this molestation came to light only
- 20 recently. Only recently did you admit this?
- 21 A. It came to light recently. I told parole
- about it, but it's something I had been
- dealing with in Cooper for the last couple of
- years. I didn't talk about it there for
- about a year, year and a half. It's

- something I could never talk about.
- 2 Q. You said you had been talking about it for
- the last year, year and a half?
- 4 A. Talking about it for the last two years.
- 5 Q. You had been talking about it for two years?
- 6 A. I hadn't been able to talk about it prior to
- 7 that time. I spent a year and a half in
- 8 Merrill Cooper before I was able to talk
- 9 about it.
- 10 Q. So this was only since the last board that
- 11 you've been dealing with this?
- 12 A. Yes.
- 13 Q. Tell me what happened.
- 14 A. As far as with me or--
- 15 Q. No. Why you became involved in this.
- 16 A. Okay. I had a lot of problems socializing
- with people. I couldn't talk to people. I
- 18 | couldn't get along with nobody. I blamed all
- my problems on everybody else's actions
- instead of taking the responsibility in
- 21 dealing with things myself.
- I couldn't deal with anything. I had
- trouble with anger. Everything just piled up
- into one big heap. My parents had got
- 25 divorced. I blamed myself for them being

What happened was the family called the 3 police because their son was missing and I 4 was asked to help look for the body. 5 Q. Not because you were a suspect of any kind. 6 7 Just because you were--A. I was asked to help look for Christopher. Q. Who asked you to help? 9 A. I believe somebody called and my parents 10 asked me to go help and everybody was just 11 12 looking around and I went to the neighbor's house and told them that I found the body and 13 then I led the police to the body. 14 Q. Did you admit what had happened immediately? 15 I was arrested the same day. 16 A. Same day. was within a few--it wasn't like that 17 18 minute. It was several hours later that I did admit to the crime. 19 Q. Did they arrest you because you admitted it 20 or because you got arrested because 21 everything led to your being the suspect? 22 A. I was arrested because I admitted the crime 23 because I went to the police station to give 24 25 an account of locating the body. My wife has a mitro 4 5 valve prolapse and she was diagnosed in 1990 and she was on medication and she did well 6 7 and got off the medication. 8 Now she's back on the medication. There was a question about my wife's job, her 9 10 previous employment, and she is looking for 11 another job and this is a note from the doctor saying what she has and from her 12 13 indicating it's one of the main reasons she's looking for less stressful work. 14 Q. What kind of work was your wife doing? 15 16 A. She works for the Division For Youth. 17 Q. As what? A. Youth counselor. 18 Q. What kind of work is she looking for? 19 20 A. Basically anything. Looking for another 21 job. COMMISSIONER BUCHANAN: Is she looking 22 23 for something in the counseling field? A. Q. Okay. In terms of your accomplishments, I 1 will state for the record that you have been 2 3 in the Merrill Cooper program since November of 1988, certainly from February of this 4 5 year, is that correct? 6 A. Yes. Q. And educationally are you close to your 8 bachelor's? 9 A. I need five courses to complete that. Q. What is your bachelor's in? 10 A. Business. I completed a legal assistance 11 12 degree also. I don't have initial verification because the school doesn't give 13 14 you a diploma until your tuition is 15 completed. I still owe them a couple hundred dollars. I wrote them for a letter. As soon 16 17 as I get the letter I'll give it to parole. Q. Anything else that you want to share with us 18 before we make a decision? 19 A. No. 20 21 Q. Thank you for coming in. A. Would you like this? 22 23 Q. Do you want to keep it in the folder? A. ## 1 DECISION 2 Denied 24 months, 7/94. Your parole is again denied. 4 is based on the heinous nature of your instant offense, murder in the second degree 6 7 and sodomy in the first degree, which 8 involved your sodomizing an eight year old 9 neighbor whom you then hung with a rope 10 causing his death. We note that you then hid his body in 11 the woods later joining the search team 12 13 looking for him and finally "finding" his 14 body. Despite prior sexual abuse counseling, 15 we note that it is only since your last board that you admitted your own abuse as a child. 16 17 This factor as well as the fact that you 18 continue to demonstrate little remorse for 19 your victim, leads us to believe that your 20 release continues to be inappropriate. 21 Continue further sex offender and theraputic counseling prior to your next board. 22 Guidelines are unspecified. 23 24 (All Commissioners concur.) 25 DePaolo-Crosby Reporting Service
