I went years without any tickets and I've 18 19 been trying to stay away from problem people 20 I have no violence on my record in 27 years. I have propensity to violence when I was 21 22 younger all right, I didn't know how to control 23 anger. I was possessive and controlling and I

did have a propensity for violence. I see that

And what I see now is a person has a choice

9	(After due deliberation by the Parole Board Panel,
LO	the following decision has been rendered:)
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1 2 BY COMMISSIONER ELOVICH: 3 Denied, hold 24 months, next appearance 8/12. 4 After review of the record and interview the 5 panel has determined that if released at this time 6 your release would be incompatible with the welfare 7 of society and would so deprecate the serious nature of your crime as to undermine respect for . 8 9 the law. This decision is based on the following 10 factors, your instant offense is murder second degree which you are serving 15 to life. 11 12 instant offense involved you stabbing a female 13 victim to death. This crime is a continuation and 14 severe escalation of a negative pattern of behavior 15 which includes a misdemeanor assault. Since your 16 last board appearance your institutional behavior 17 has been poor. You incurred multiple tier III 18 disciplinary infractions, one of which was for harassment and threats. The board notes your 19 20 program completions, vocational accomplishments, 21 work assignments and letters of support. More compelling, however, is the extreme and brutal 22 violence exhibited in the instant offense, your 23 callous disregard for the life of the victim, and 24 your poor behavior in prison. As such your release
