Dear Hon Ferraro,

Congratulations on your election to the position of Vice-President of the Democratic Party. As a women and feminist, I am particularly delighted that your talents have been recognised and utilised.

We in New Zealand are looking anxiously at America's forthcoming elections, and at the pressure that the present political leaders are putting on Hon David Lange, our new Prime Minister to reconsider his and his party's stand on bringing legislation to make New Zealand a nuclear free tone. The peace question was one of the major issues facing the candidates in our recent elections, and we peace people believe that the large majority that Labour enjoyed, plus the substantial number of votes
