Dear Mrs. Ferraro,

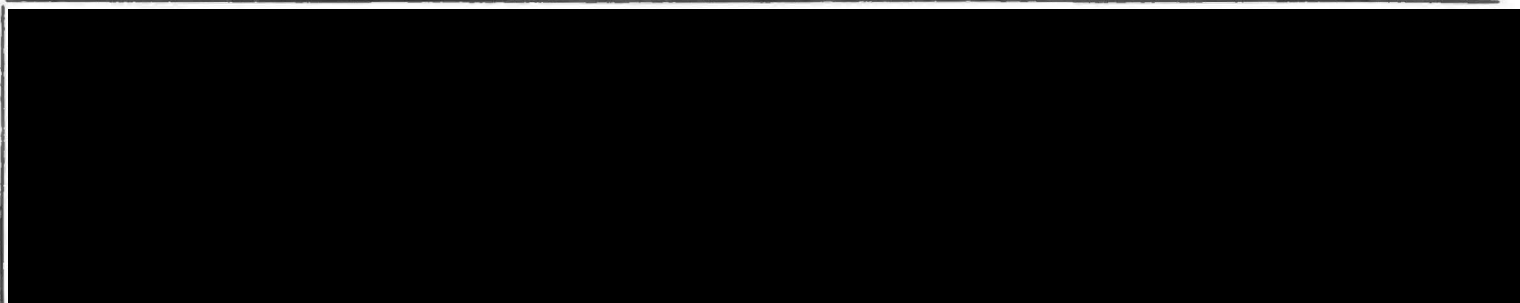
Don't you worry about not understanding foreign policy. Nations are just like adults who are just like children: everybody wants and needs things, gets hurt feelings - quickly, resents others' benefits, gets jealous, angry, greedy and scared; only adults camouflage their reactions with sullenness or wit, and countries use diplomats. I have just returned from a year in Montpellier, France, on a Fulbright Teaching Assistantship and my personal contact with people from England, Ireland, Scotland, Germany, Austria, Russia, Spain, Italy and Morocco more than my daily thorough reading of European newspapers and articles showed me that if you can see the individual lives behind the huge walls of propaganda, media coverage and prejudices, you will come to find that all people in all countries are alike (that is to say: each person unique and deserving of individual attention) and that

we all want the same things: peace,
economic and social security, the chance
to pursue our own lives. I ~~truly~~^{realize} foreign
policy is different than personal under-
standing of nations' situations and their
relationships to one another, but one could
spend a lifetime trying to weigh all
angles of a situation, and much action
will be called for in the next few years.
I hope you and Mr. Mondale will be
elected; I hope when you get elected that
your good will, instincts and maternal
warmth will give you the strength to
cut through the male nonsense that only
with a build-up of weapons do we
preserve peace; and I want you to know
that the wishes and prayers, not to
mention the hope, of many women in
this country are rising with pride
and courage ~~as they~~^{as they} realize that you may
help influence the most powerful level
of decision-making ^{IN THE COUNTRY} for both domestic
and international issues in the years to
come. Ms. Ferraro, congratulations on your
nomination.
