Dear Ms. Ferraro,

Is there any possibility you can use your influence to investigate procedures in New York City for the distribution of overseas absentee ballots?

I sent a request for absentee ballot in April-May... having received no confirmation that my request was even received I submitted another in August. And still the stub on the request which merely confirms receipt of request has not been returned... thus I have little hope that my ballot request is being processed.

How can I vote for you if I don't receive my ballot?

I sent my request to County Board of Elections, 131 Varick Street, New York, N.Y. 10013. The last city I was registered in was Brooklyn Heights.

I only write this in advance to do all I can to vote, because in 1980 I was a victim of a much publicized gross negligence in distributing overseas absentee ballots. I received my last one 10 days after the election. Which proves that someone somewhere in Brooklyn agreed I should have had one.

I would really appreciate anything you could do to insure I am not denied my constitutional right to vote.
