- ANTICIPATING THE NATIONS NEEDS FOR ECONOMIC KNOWLEDGE. By National Bureau of Economic Research, Inc. New York: Columbia University Press. 1966. Pp. x, 92. An analysis of the growing need for economic data.
- BUSINESS LAW: PRINCIPLES AND CASES (UNIFORM COMMERCIAL CODE EDITION). By Harold F. Lusk. Homewood: Richard D. Irwin, Inc. 1966. Pp. xxi, 1236. Both historical background and practical application of business law, including recent developments and changes brought about by the Uniform Commercial Code.
- CASES AND MATERIALS ON CORPORATIONS. By Alexander H. Frey, C. Albert Morris, Jr. and Jesse H. Choper. Boston: Little, Brown & Co. 1966. Pp. xiv, 1405. \$13.50. A collection of materials, the classification based upon major types of corporate transactions rather than legal concepts such as "de facto" or "ultra vires."
- COMPUTERS AND THE LAW. Edited by Robert P. Bigelow. Chicago: Commerce Clearing House, Inc. 1966. Pp. ix, 150. \$5.00 paperbound. A handbook designed to acquaint the profession with data processing equipment and techniques which are currently available for legal research.
- CRIME AND ITS CORRECTION: AN INSTITUTIONAL SURVEY OF ATTITUDES AND PRACTICES. By John Conrad. Berkeley: University of California Press. 1965. Pp. viii, 312. \$7.50. A world-wide study of correctional institutions questioning the effectiveness of various penal systems.
- CRIMINAL PROCEDURE UNDER THE FEDERAL RULES (VOL. I). By Lester B. Orfield. Rochester: The Lawyers Co-operative Publishing Co. 1966. Pp. xv, 856. A detailed discussion of Rules I-IX and cases construing them.
- DEFENSE OF THE POOR IN CRIMINAL CASES IN AMERICAN STATE COURTS. By Lee Silverstein. Chicago: American Bar Foundation. 1965. Pp. viii, 280. \$7.00. A synthesis of data obtained in state-by-state audits of the methods utilized to provide counsel for indigents accused of crimes.
- LAW AND THE FAMILY—NEW YORK (VOL. I: DISSOLUTION OF THE FAMILY UNIT: DIVORCE, SEPARATION AND ANNULMENT). By Henry H. Foster, Jr. and Doris Jonas Freed. Rochester: Lawyers Co-operative Publishing Co. 1966. Pp. xxxiii, 721. A comprehensive study, with supplements, of the New York law of domestic relations.
- AN ESTATE PLANNER'S HANDBOOK. By James F. Farr. Boston: Little, Brown & Co. 1966. Pp. xxiv, 663. \$15.00. A guide for the practitioner containing a revision of the material on revocable trusts and pour-over provisions.
- EXPANDING LIBERTIES: FREEDOM'S GAINS IN POSTWAR AMERICA. By Milton R. Konvitz. New York: The Viking Press. 1966. Pp. xvii, 429. \$8.95. The author traces the role of the Supreme Court in the preservation and expansion of old liberties and the evolution of new ones since World War II.

A GENERAL THEORY OF TAX STRUCTURE CHANGE DURING ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. By Harley H. Hinrichs. Chicago: Commerce Clearing House, Inc. 1966. Pp. xvi, 154. The author compiles data from numerous countries in pursuit of a general theory to help explain, teach, and possibly predict tax structure change during periods of economic expansion.

THE GOOD SAMARITAN AND THE LAW. Edited by James M. Ratcliffe. Garden City: Doubleday & Co. 1966. Pp. vx, 300. \$1.45 paperbound. A collection of essays on the morality and legal problems of aiding those in danger.

THE GOVERNMENT CONTRACTOR AND THE GENERAL ACCOUNTING OFFICE. By the Machinery and Allied Products Institute & The Counsel for Technological Advancement. Washington: The Machinery and Allied Products Institute. 1966. Pp. ix, 215. \$10.00. Designed to enhance the reader's knowledge of the operation of the General Accounting Office, especially with respect to procurement contracts.

1966 GUIDEBOOK TO LABOR RELATIONS. By the CCH Editorial Staff. Chicago: Commerce Clearing House, Inc. 1966. Pp. 367. \$5.00 paperbound. A discussion of the basic principles of labor law geared to practical use.

HOSTAGES OF FORTUNE: CHILD LABOR REFORM IN NEW YORK STATE. By Jeremy P. Felt. Syracuse: Syracuse University Press. 1965. Pp. xv, 276. \$6.95. An historical account of the various forces which propelled the child labor reform movement in New York.

LAW AND PSYCHOLOGY IN CONFLICT. By James Marshall. New York: Bobbs-Merrill Co. 1966. Pp. xiv, 119. \$5.95. The author maintains that the adversary system is often unrelated to reality in light of psychological studies which show that men have little ability to observe, recall, or relate.

THE LAWYER IN MODERN SOCIETY. By Vern Countryman and Ted Finman. Boston: Little, Brown & Co. 1966. Pp. xxii, 911. \$13.00. A collection of cases and materials designed to acquaint students with the personal role of the lawyer, rather than the law, in solving legal problems.

MOVIES, CENSORSHIP AND THE LAW. By Ira H. Carmen. Ann Arbor: The University of Michigan Press. 1966. Pp. x, 339. \$7.95. A study of movie censorship in the United States with an analysis of the role of the Constitution in the censorship debate.

OIL & GAS: FEDERAL INCOME TAXATION. By Kenneth G. Miller. Chicago: Commerce Clearing House, Inc. 1966. Pp. ix, 453. \$10.00 paperbound. Federal income tax rules which apply specifically to the oil and gas producing industries.

OPINION OF THE COURT. By William Woolfolk. Garden City: Doubleday & Co. 1966. Pp. 496. \$5.95. Fictionalized account of the private and professional life of a modern Supreme Court Justice.

- PLANNING ZONING & SUBDIVISION: A SUMMARY OF STATUTORY LAW IN THE 50 STATES. By Robert M. Anderson and Bruce B. Roswig. Albany: New York State Federation of Official Planning Organizations. 1966. Pp. 231. \$6.50 paperbound. Summaries and charts which describe selected features of zoning statutes without reference to applicable case law or local practice.
- SOCIAL DIMENSIONS OF LAW AND JUSTICE. By Julius Stone. Stanford: Stanford University Press. 1966. Pp. xxxv, 933. \$18.50. An eminent legal scholar covers a wide range of problems which confront modern democratic governments in seeking to use law as an instrument of social control.
- A SOCIAL HISTORY OF ENGLISH LAW. By Alan Harding. Baltimore: Penguin Books. 1966. Pp. 503. \$1.65 paperbound. A study of the parallel development of legal and social institutions in England.
- STATE LEGISLATURES IN AMERICAN POLITICS. Edited by Alexander Heard. Englewood Cliffs: Prentice-Hall, Inc. 1966. Pp. vi, 182. \$3.95. A collection of essays analyzing common problems of state legislatures including collection and disbursement of revenue, protection of citizens, and administration of federal money.
- STUDIES ON BAIL. Edited by Caleb Foote. Philadelphia: International Printing Co. 1966. Pp. vii, 288. A series of articles originally published in the University of Pennsylvania Law Review.
- TAX BURDEN ON INDIAN AGRICULTURE. By Ved P. Gandhi. Chicago: Commerce Clearing House, Inc. 1966. Pp. xix, 240. The author develops and applies techniques of analyzing the Indian agriculture, its tax burdens, the total fiscal burden, and the effect of government expenditures. He concludes that more tax revenue can be derived from that sector of the economy.
- TAXATION IN FRANCE. By Harvard Law School International Tax Program. Chicago: Commerce Clearing House, Inc. 1966. Pp. lxxi, 1241. \$25.00. The first systematic study in English of the entire tax structure of France.
- THE TRIAL OF STEVEN TRUSCOTT. By Isabel LeBourdais. Philadelphia: J. B. Lippincott Co. 1966. Pp. 257. \$4.95. A documented account of the trial and conviction for murder of an allegedly innocent fourteen year old boy.
- 1966 U.S. MASTER TAX GUIDE. By the CCH Editorial Staff. Chicago: Commerce Clearing House, Inc. 1965. Pp. 560. \$4.00 paperbound. A compilation of the 1965 changes in tax law.
