Appellant challenges the September 2020 determination of the Board, denying release and imposing a 18-month hold. Appellant's instant offense is for driving a car, with her minor children in the back seat, while under the influence of numerous prescription medications. She ignored the warnings of her children, continued to drive erratically, and then crossed over the yellow line and crashed into two motorcycles, killing one person and seriously injuring another. Appellant raises many issues. One of the issues raised concerned her receipt of an EEC.

The Board decision is silent about the receipt of an EEC. The Board decision also erroneously uses the deprecation standard, which doesn't apply in EEC cases. As such, a de novo interview is warranted.

Recommendation: Vacate and remand for de novo interview.
